SCOPE OF THE CONFERENCE

Genotoxicity, mutagenicity and carcinogenicity stand for the most adverse toxicological impacts of chemicals on human beings and environmental organisms.

Therefore, natural water bodies like surface waters, ground waters and drinking water resources should be saved from anthropogenic impacts of substances with genotoxic potentials as far as possible.
